- The survey was conducted via online interview. Invitations to complete the survey were sent out to millionaires living in G20 member countries who are members of the panel.

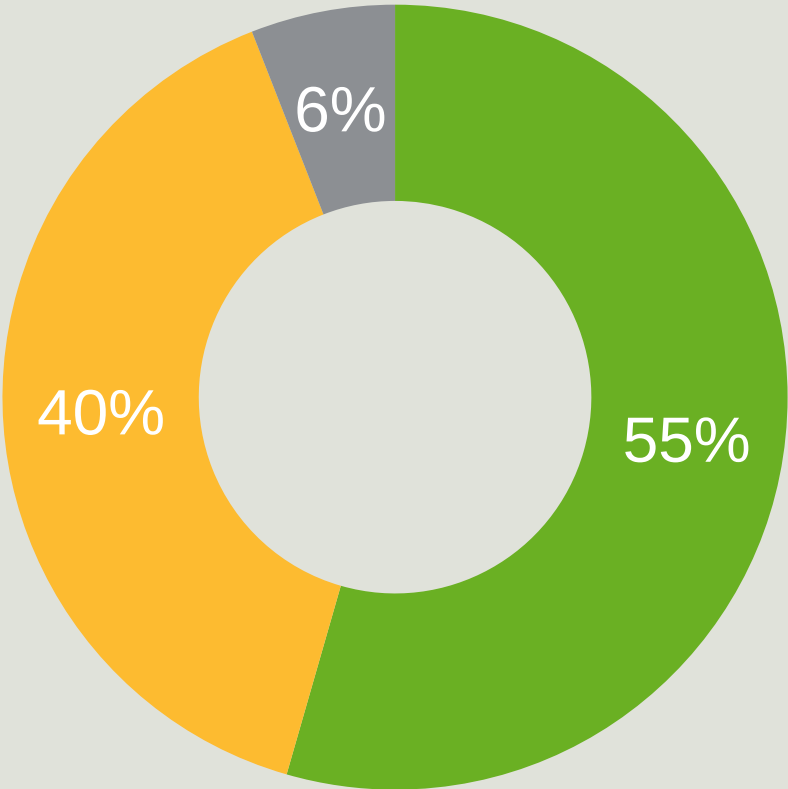
Population Sampled

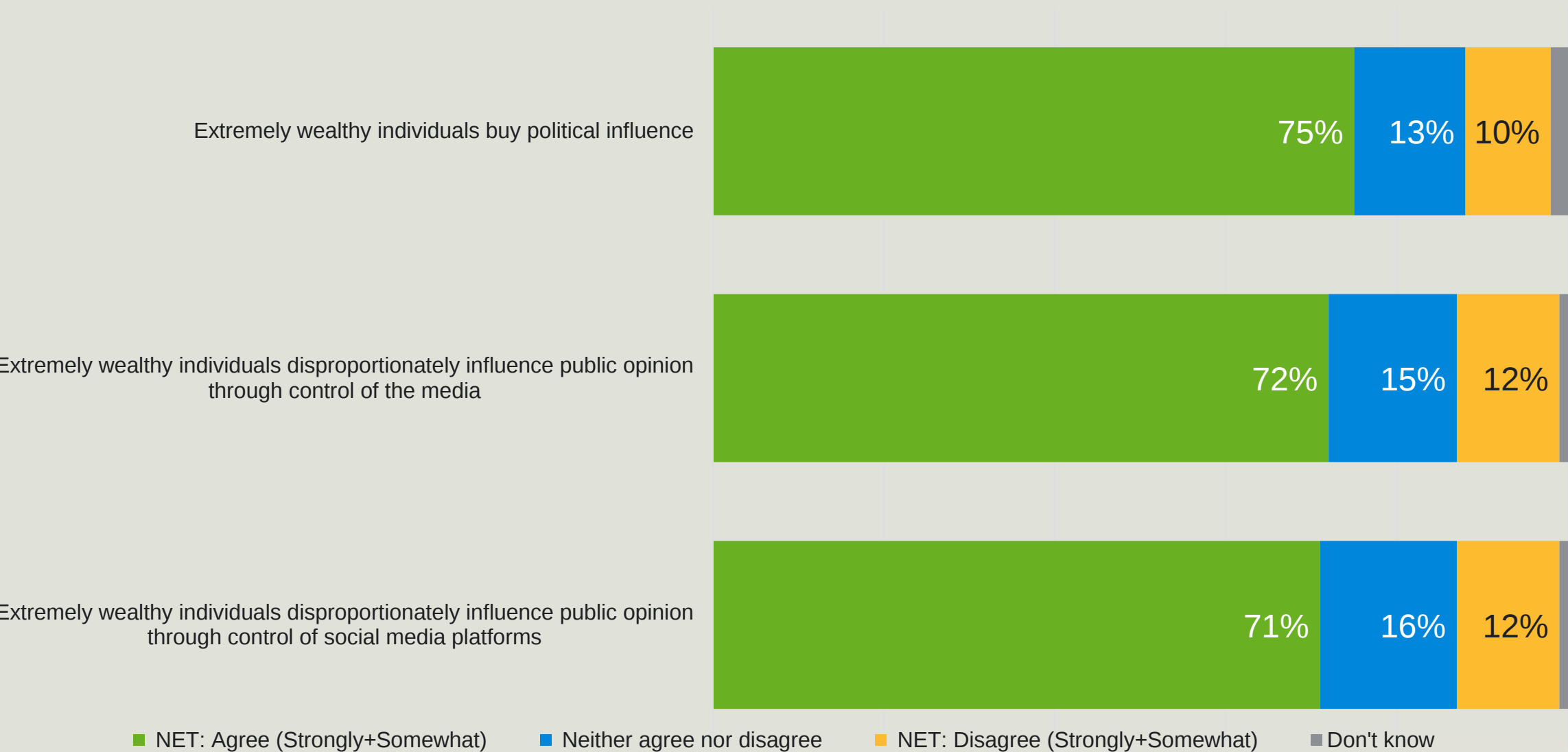

- Don't know

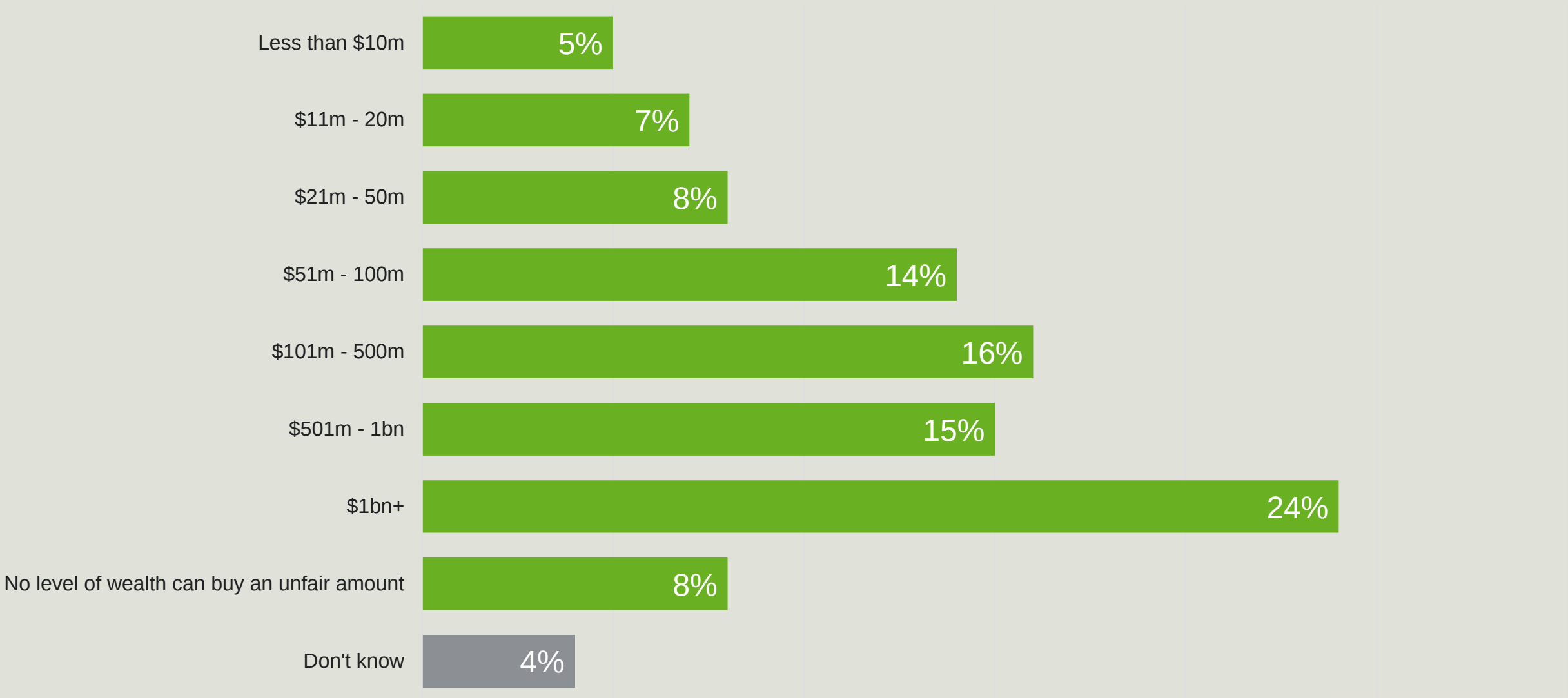

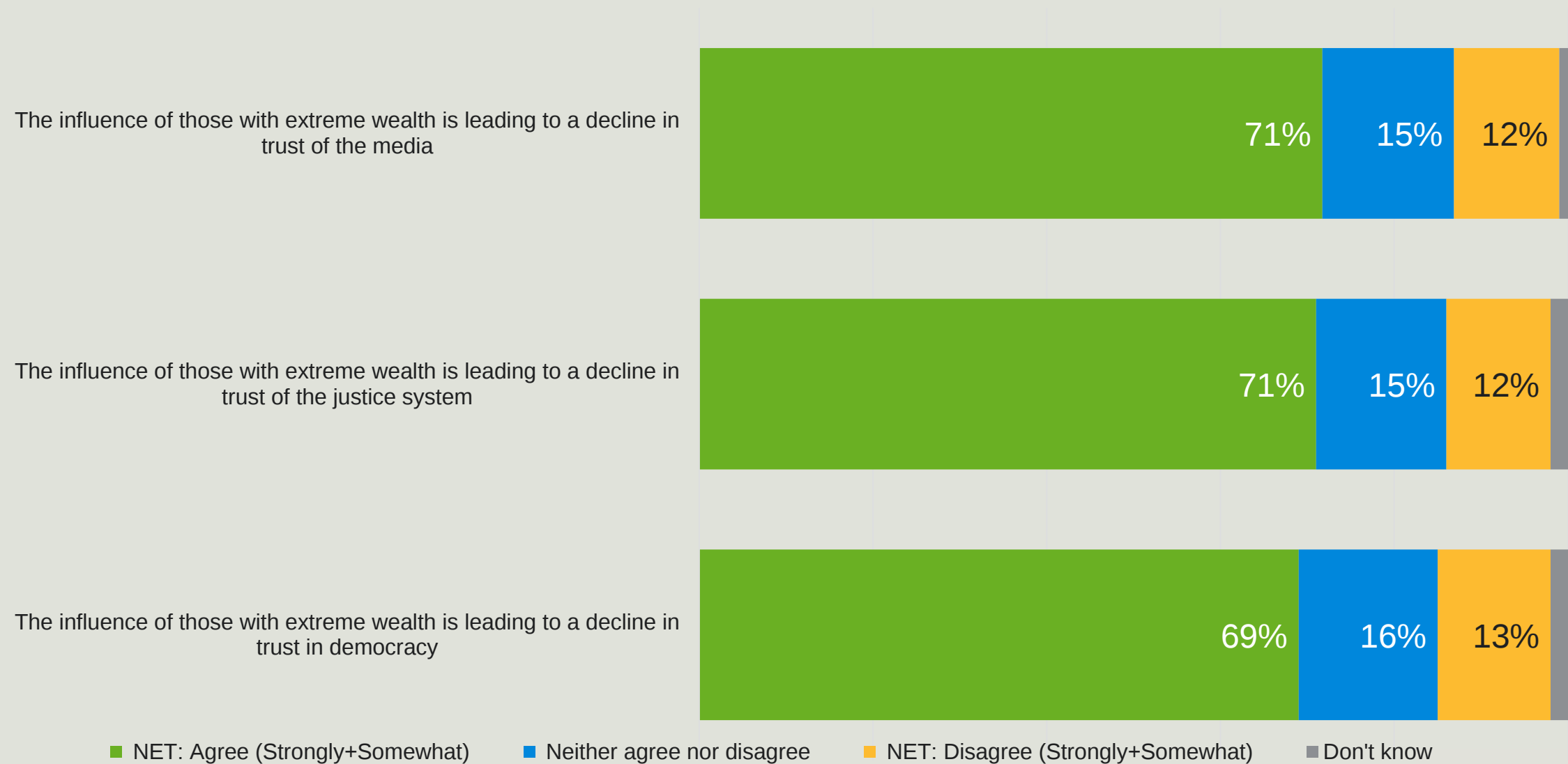

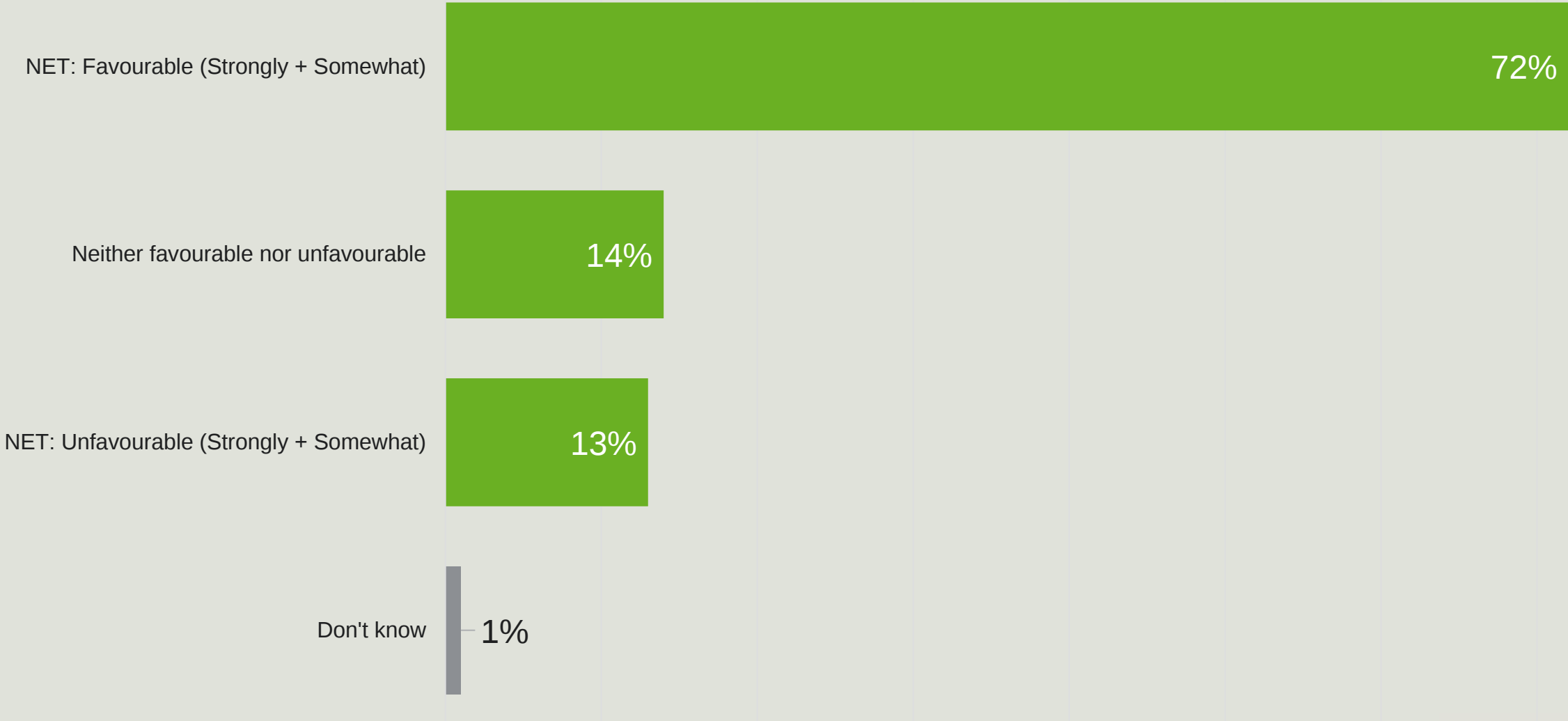
Q3. What level of wealth if any, do you think allows an individual to buy an unfair amount of political influence?



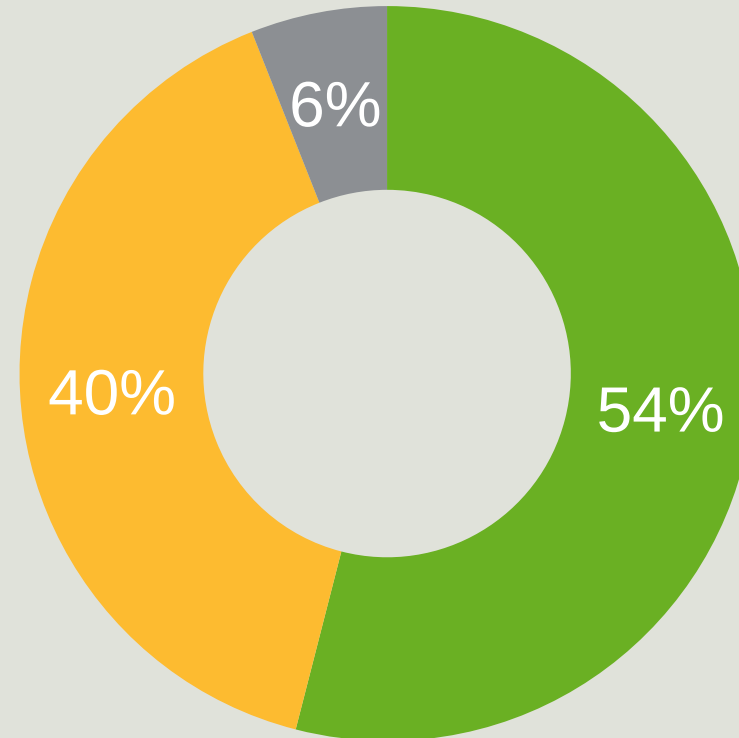
Q4_Summary. Recent reports show a global decline in trust of government and media. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following?

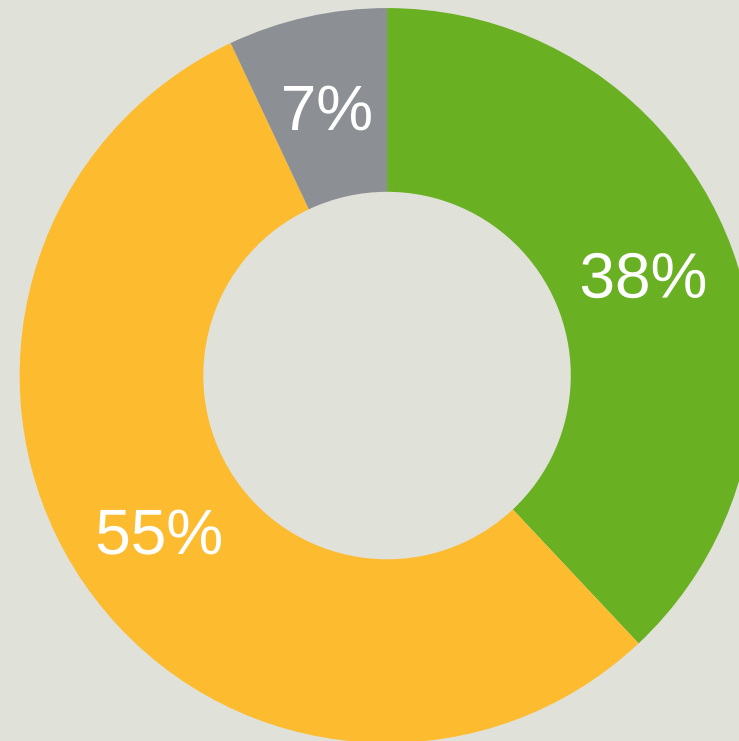


Q6. Which of the following statements is closest to your view?



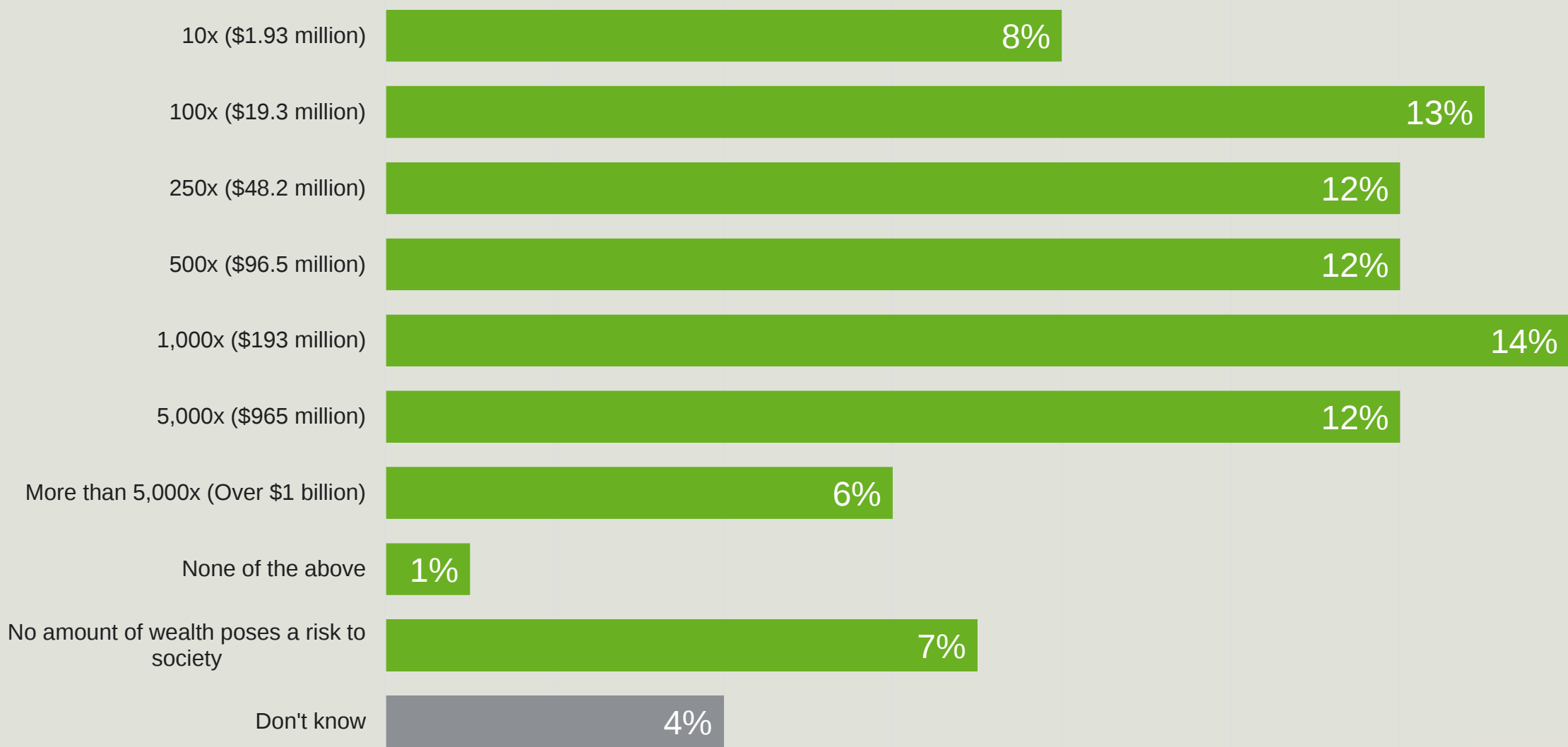

Q7. Which of the following statements is closest to your view?

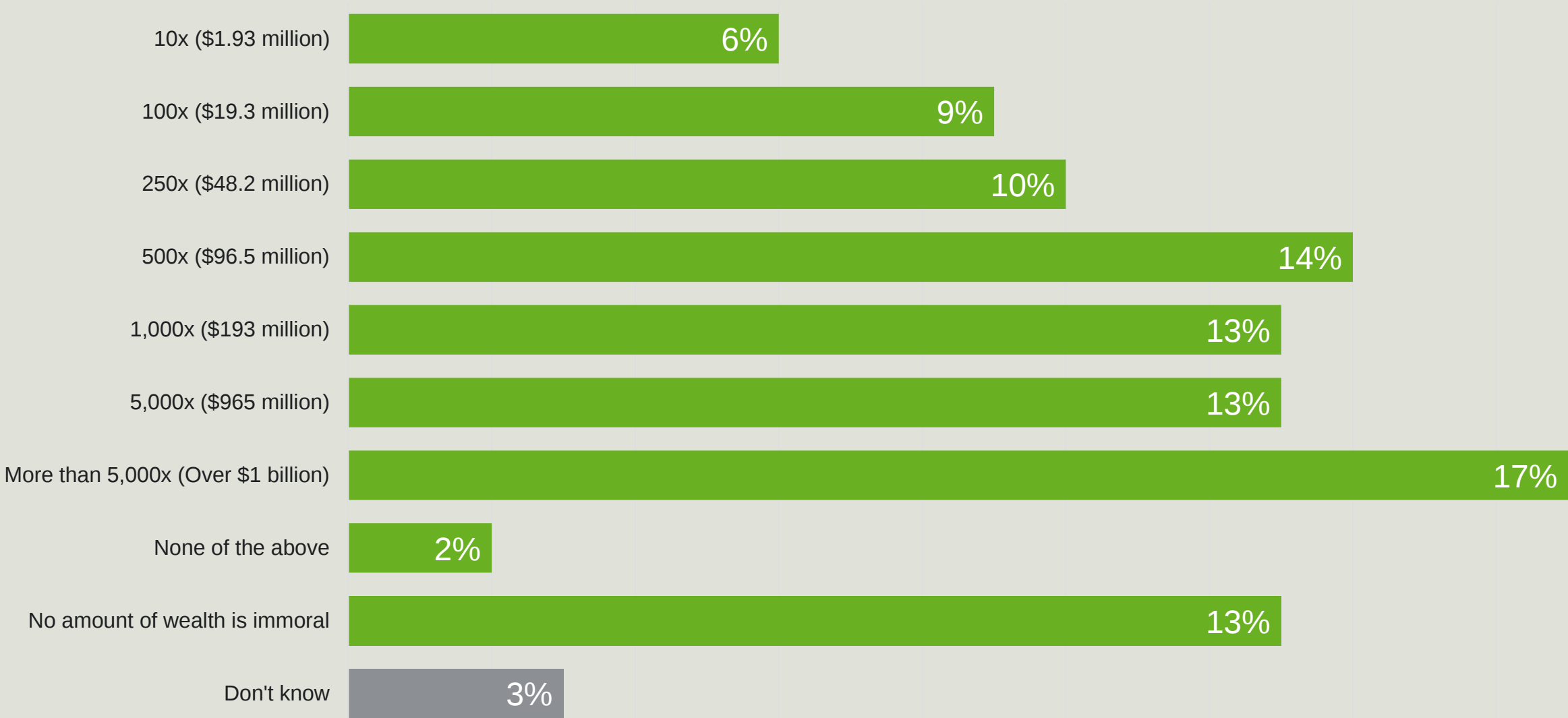


- Our political leaders do have the will to tackle extreme wealth

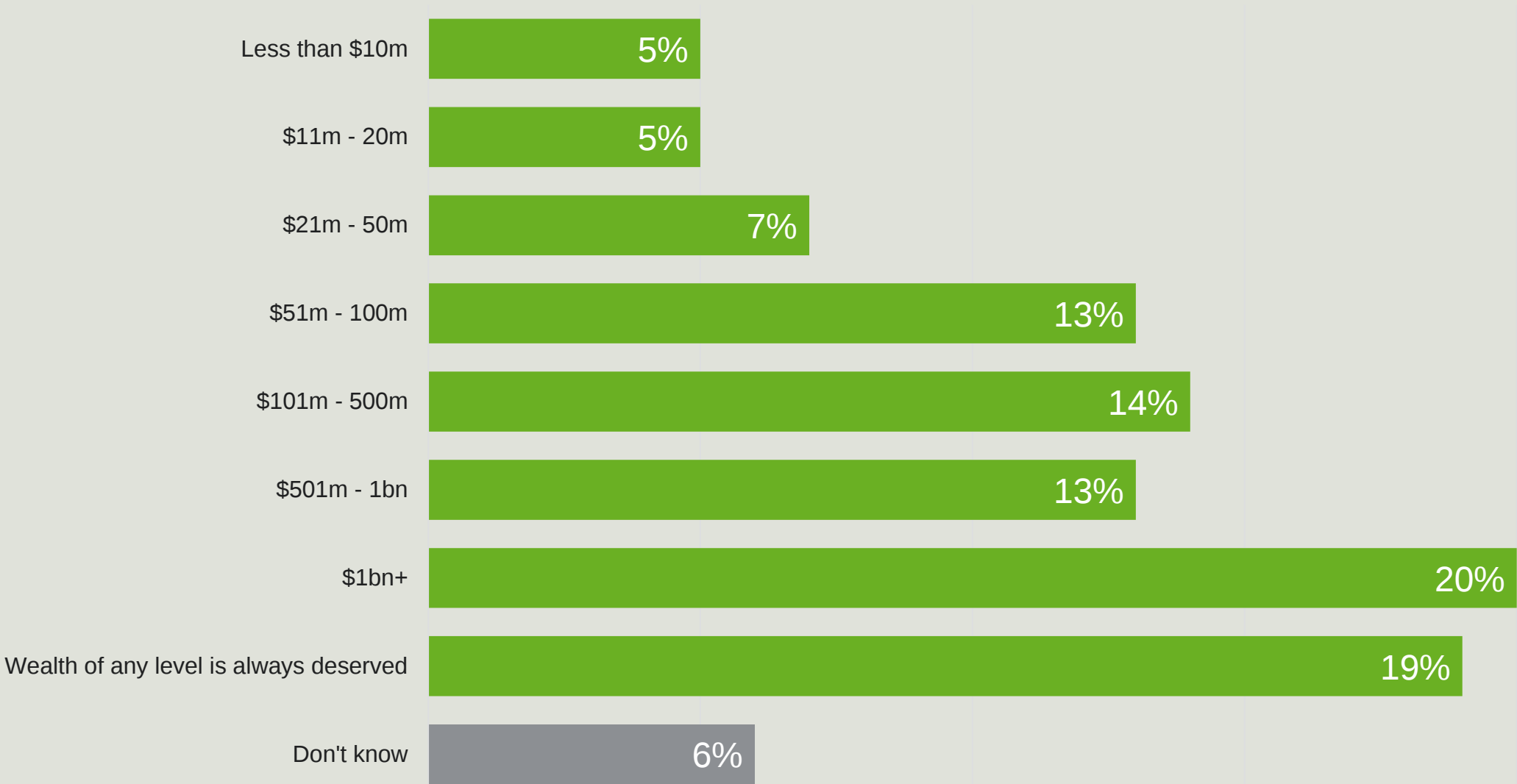

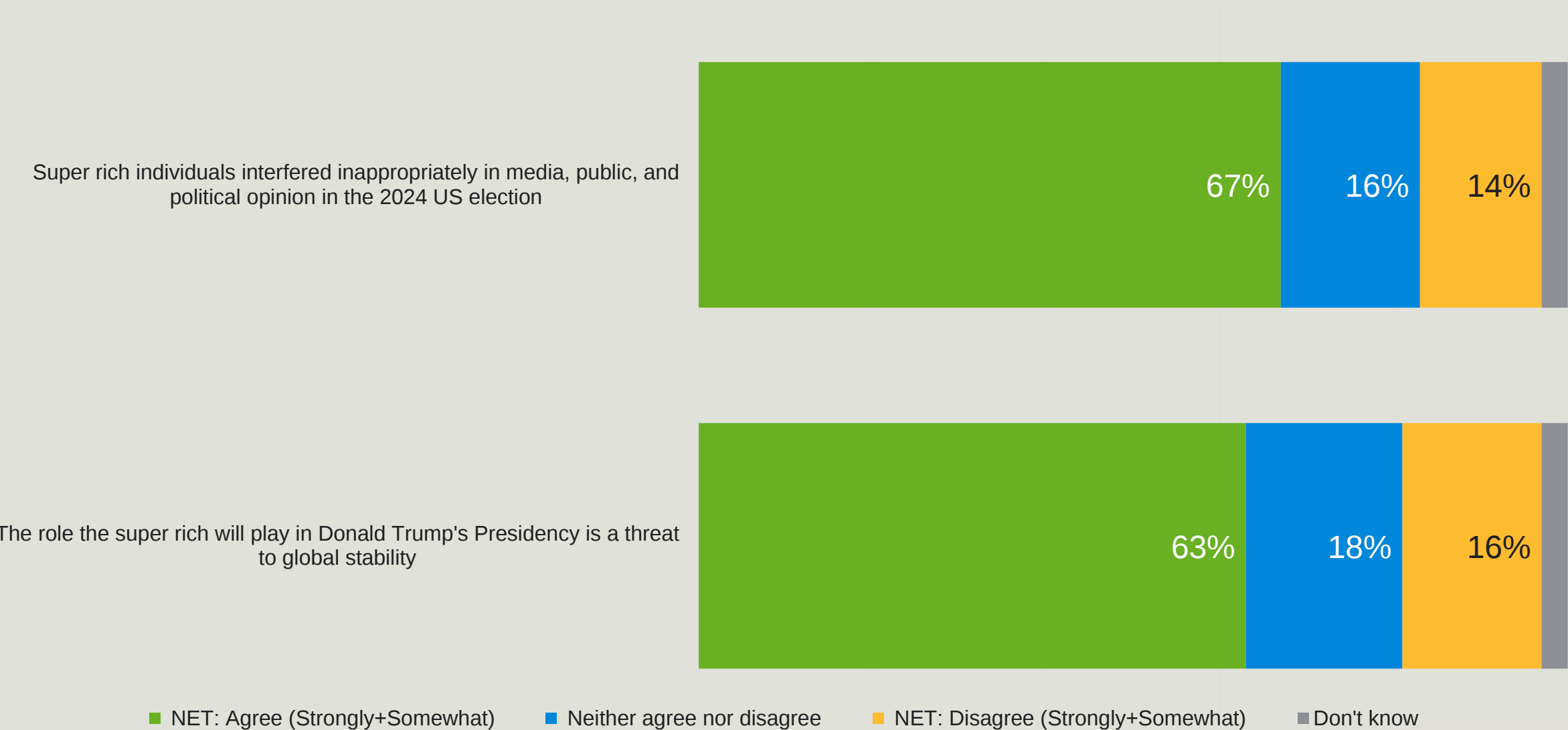
Q9. The average median household wealth in the US, the world's richest country, is \$193,000. As a multiple of the median household wealth, at what point do you think wealth becomes immoral?
